INTRODUCTION

The LINK-O-LOON® Cube is ideal for decor and sculpture. It can be easily adapted to other themes by changing the colors used. Pool parties are an instant hit with the cube as it will even float on the water!

APPLICATIONS

MATERIALS & EQUIPMENT

- 48 x 30cm (12") LINK-O-LOON®s
- 60 x 12cm (5") rounds
- Air Inflator
- Balloon Sizer



STEP BY STEP

Instructions for one Column

1. Air inflate two chains of eight 30cm (12") LINK-O-LOON®s size to 28cm (11").
2. Tie them into rings of eight and put four 12cm (5") round duplets on the four outside corners of each ring to create two squares.
3. Air inflate four clusters of two 30cm (12") LINK-O-LOON®s sized to 28cm (11"). On both ends place a 12cm (5") round. These are the connectors to join the two squares together.
4. Lock the 12cm (5") rounds from the four connectors onto the eight corners of the two squares creating the frame of the cube with clusters of three 12cm (5") rounds on the eight corners.
5. Create six clusters of four 30cm (12") LINK-O-LOON®s sized to 28cm (11"). Place a 12cm (5") round on the tips of each cluster.
6. Place 12cm (5") duplets on the middle of each of the six LINK-O-LOON®s clusters.
7. Lock the six clusters on the six sides of the cube, by attaching the 12cm (5") rounds on the connection points of the LINK-O-LOON®s.
